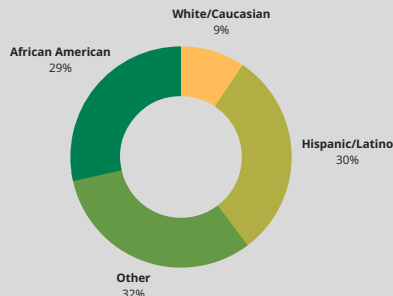

COMMUNITIES OF COLOR EXPERIENCING POVERTY IN PA



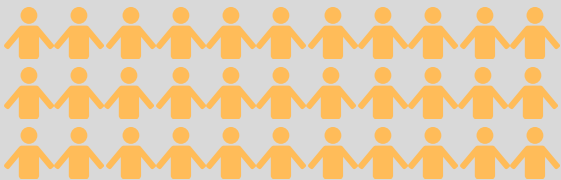

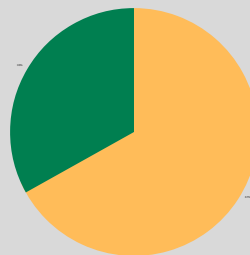
UNION AND SNYDER COUNTIES:
